Planters

This year the Parish Council decided to provide summer bedding for the half baskets positioned on various buildings in the parish as usual but not for the baskets on lamp columns, for which it chose to provide an alternative of three-tier tower planters. Four of these were placed in the centre of Chinley on the wide pavement on Green Lane and one was placed outside Buxworth School, at the top of Brookside. Many people have expressed their appreciation of the colourful display produced and indeed everyone seems to agree that this has been spectacular and uplifting.



During the final preparation of this newsletter the weather has turned, heralding the arrival of colder darker days. By the time it is delivered the planters will most likely have faded. When removed, they will be replaced by three winter planted ones, which we hope will provide renewed lift to the spirit of residents and visitors.

Playgrounds & Chinley Car Park

Weekly inspections of the Playgrounds at Chinley & Buxworth are now being carried out by four members of the council. Weeds have also been cleared from around these areas and the car park fencing and path at Chinley. As small degree of fly tipping in this area was discovered recently which also had to be removed. Cllr Knox would particularly like to thank the public spirited gentleman who helped him to clear up and who has since cut a lot of branches back and cleared weeds off the path.

Repairs to pot holes and surface damage, mainly on the access road will also have been carried out on 14th October, so it should be looking much tidier. All that is except for the hole that appeared in the middle of the car park overnight on Monday 29th September, when heavy rain appears of have damaged a drain. This is being investigated by Derbyshire County Council to determine who is responsible for the repair.

Buxworth Allotments Project & Community Orchard

The approved work has commenced with extension of the access track from Station Road. Sadly a challenging problem has been encountered and we are in the process of formulating a solution.

However, plans for the orchard and picnic area have attracted interest from Hope Construction Apprentices, who are seeking permission to give assistance as part of their Community Initiative.

THE BLACKBROOK CONSERVATION SOCIETY

The object of the Society is to make as many of the Rights of Ways as possible available to walkers of all abilities. We monitor and report back to DCC all faults on the local Rights of Ways and we also walk as many as possible during the summer months.

In the Chinley, Buxworth Parish we have found numerous faults over the years and are pleased to report that some 25 were cleared this year. These range from signposts, stiles, ground surface state etc. The best surprise was when we found a new footbridge had been installed by DCC on a footpath from near Barn Cottages on Dolly Lane to Big Tree Farm and 2, very boggy stretches, there had been improved. This is the 2nd footbridge that we have had installed recently over some difficult stream crossings.
