Precept 2016/17 - In January, the Parish Council agreed the budget for 2016/17. It resolved to keep the Parish Council portion of the Band D property Council Tax charge the same as for 2015/16.

The budget for 2016/17 of £61,080 and precept of £51,873.74 have been set. This means there will be no increase in the Parish Council portion of the Band D property Council Tax charge this year, it will remain at £49-03, equivalent to 94 pence per week.

Buxworth Allotments Project

Tenders for the work required to provide car parking have been received, considered and a contractor chosen. This work will now commence as soon as possible.

The cultivation area has had fencing put in place to three sides. Levelling of the top soil, provision of access paths and the remainder of the fencing needs to be carried out to complete the site ready for occupation.

People on the waiting list are due to be contacted soon to make tenancy arrangements and consider formation of an Allotment Association which the Chinley Allotment Association has offered to mentor for 12 months.

Chinley & Buxworth Community Centre

Transfer of the Community Centre from Derbyshire County Council to the Parish Council is now due in mid-March. It will then be leased to the Community Association and essential safety repairs carried out.

The joint project team continues to work on the plans to build a new community centre and improve the car parking and children's play facilities. Grants are being sought for professional support and it is hoped that outline plans for public consultation and feedback will be drawn up by the summer. The project is still in its very early stages and will take time, hard work and much fundraising over the next few years but this is surely a very exciting prospect for our community!


